It was moved by Deputy Mayor Burke and seconded by Councillor Canning that the Town of Wabush wave tipping fees for LW Gun

### COMMITTEE REPORT: PLANNING

It was moved by Councillor Curran and seconded by Councillor AuCoin that the Town of Wabush approve sale of new and used skidoo trailers located at 18-32 Commercial Street as per business request. This is a requirement from Service NL to seek Municipal approval. All in Favour.

It was moved by Councillor Curran and seconded by Councillor AuCoin that the Town of Wabush decline a request to sell an easement piece of land to property 142 Bowater Drive Extension as this land is to remain green space and as a utility easement. This piece of land does not meet the minimum lot frontage for development. If the Town decided to sell this land in the future, there will be a public notice issued as per Section 201.2 of the Municipalities Act. All in Favour.

### **Motion Carried**

It was moved by Councillor Curran and seconded by Councillor Burke that the Town of Wabush allow 44 Third Avenue to subdivide on the following conditions:

- 1) Building that is on both property lines is to be removed.
- 2) If building is being relocated to another business or to another property owned by current owner, as per Service NL requirements for buildings, must seek Service NL approval and an Occupancy permit from the Town.
- 3) Building fronting First St will now be non-compliant due to setbacks, require a complete real property report as the survey provided is not a true RPR.
- 4) Surveys will be forward to MAA for reassessment and new address.
- 5) Letter signed by owner from our legal department, that any cost to future owners or the Town in relation to non-compliance is the responsibility of the sellers including the cost to review said non-compliance.
