In recent weeks, we have seen a heightened level of concern related to the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19). We recognize that this may be an unsettling time and want to provide an update on the actions the Town of Wabush is taking to safeguard the health and well-being of our residents, our employees and their families.

We will continue to serve residents as usual. Residents are reminded that there are a number of options available to you to make payments on your account.

1. Residents who bank with BMO, Scotia Bank and the Credit Union can make payments on their account through their bank's **on-line bill payment**. Search for **Wabush, Town of, Tax and Utilities**. The account code is on your annual bill.
2. **Pre-authorized debit**. Forms can be obtained at the town hall or via email at info@wabush.ca
3. **E-transfer**. Payments can be sent via e-transfer to Townclerk@wabush.ca
4. **On-Line**. You can also access your account from home 24/7 using Wabush.WS.Townsuite.com. Through this site you can view your account balance and make payments using Debit, Master Card and Visa. The access code required to set up your on-line account was printed on your tax bill.

We would like to advise those residents that choose to pay your tax bill on-line with Master Card and Visa you will be charged a service fee at the time of payment. Master Card and Visa is only available on our on-line portal. We **DO NOT** process credit card payments at the Town Hall.

For your safety, we have increased the intensity of cleaning at the Town Hall, we are providing additional hand sanitizer and are educating our employees on best practices recommended by public health authorities. We're actively monitoring the situation and will continue to take guidance from public health authorities.

As we look forward, we'll continue to monitor developments in this global health situation. We remain confident in the actions we've already taken, and our plans to safeguard the health of our residents and our employees.
