RECREATION FACILITIES – ALERT LEVEL 2

FACILITY OPENINGS

On Monday, June 29 we will be officially opening 6 facilities to the public; Centennial Playground, including the Splashpad, IOC Family Park – Harrie Lake, Skatepark / Multisport Court, Tanya Trail & Beach, Al Thoms Softball Area and Stan Jackowski Soccer Area. These facilities will open under the COVID-19 guidelines, restrictions, and cleaning protocols.

Providing these Recreation Facilities must be a community effort; the Municipality is committed to adhering to the government protocols and following the guidelines in place, but we need your help in keeping these spaces safe for everyone. Please remember that these facilities are **USE AT YOUR OWN RISK** and will remain open ONLY if we all follow these guidelines.

CLEAN TRIP KIT

In order to meet the Government Regulations, we are asking all users of the facilities to be prepared and bring personal hand sanitizer and / or Lysol wipes, better known as a **CLEAN TRIP KIT** with you. Without fulltime monitoring of these facilities, the Municipality will not have access to hand sanitizer on site for public use. Carrying a **CLEAN TRIP KIT** allows users to avail of more facilities, while maintaining a balanced approach to addressing COVID-19 guidelines.

CLEANING AND DISINFECTING

All facilities are mandated to be cleaned and disinfected twice per day. We have a dedicated team for daily cleaning and disinfecting and ask that the public respect the forthcoming schedule to allow this work to be completed. This will maximize the usage time of each facility.

SIGNAGE

Signage will be provided at each facility, with friendly reminders of COVID-19 guidelines. These guidelines include but are not limited to: social distancing, being prepared with a **Clean Trip Kit**, respecting closed amenities, covering your mouth when you cough or sneeze, avoiding busy times, staying home if you are ill, frequent washing and sanitizing of your hands.
