Highlights from 2020

Before I present the 2021 budget, I would like to highlight the achievements of council from the 2020 budget:

- Work began on the Industrial Park Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Application has been submitted to the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Municipalities to do more road reconstruction
- Work began on Phase II of the Wabush Business Park
- The Town invested in a new electric Zamboni
- The Town has sourced a new snow blower attachment
- The Town installed new fencing at the Bev Martin Ballfield as well as the ballfield on Bowater
- The Town purchased a new sand/dump truck that is in service
- Substantial work has been completed on the East side of the Jean Lake trail
- Playground equipment was installed at Jean Lake
- New fire equipment was received

Budget 2021

As Deputy Mayor and chair of the finance committee for the Town of Wabush, I am confident that the 2021 budget is a great foundation for our plans for the future to ensure that we are committed to keeping Wabush a great place to live while offering services that promote health and wellness and entice business growth as well. I present to you our 2021 budget of \$14,326,356.00. This includes capital spend in the amount of \$8,022,356.00



Capital Items planned for 2021

Here are some of the highlights:

- Purchase of new boards for the arena
- Sods for ball fields and cemetery
- Purchase of a new street sweeper
- Purchase of a grader gate
- Pre- engineering for fresh water pump house
- Purchase of plow and sand spreader
- Work will be completed on the Business Park lots and they will be available for sale in 2021.
- Lots on Snow's Drive will be advertised for sale in 2021.
- Work will continue on the Business Park Wastewater Treatment Plant.

We are please to advise residents and business within the municipality that there are no new tax changes for 2021.

The discount to seniors' that was offered in previous years will continue at the same rate for 2021. Seniors should note, however, to avail of this discount, applications must be received by the town clerk by **June 30**, 2021
