This Council agrees to provide the Ultimate Recipient share value of \$868,638.00 in funding for this project and authorizes the Mayor/Committee Chair and the Town Clerk to enter into a funding agreement with the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure on behalf of the Town of Wabush.
