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COMMITTEE REPORT: PUBLIC WORKS

Councillor Cole spoke on behalf of Public Works. Councillor Cole wished Mr. Lilly good luck and thank you for his dedication to the Town of Wabush. Mr. Lilly is currently on vacation and then retiring.

Councillor Cole informed the public that the water break on Cabot Drive is scheduled for next Wednesday, weather permitting.

The water tower's system is run by a very old system. (Windows 95) that we are trying to repair/replace. Company out of St. John's working on it.

Snowblower is around town and is doing a great job. Will do a second pass this week.

Mayor reported that we are working on water tower issues and that is affecting the water pressure around town.

COMMITTEE REPORT: RECREATION

Report Attached

Deputy Mayor O'Brien has reached out to the chair of recreation in Labrador City. She has not received a response. DM O'Brien is not giving up on recreation. 80% of users are Labrador City. A sustainability report is not feasible at this time and no other communities with this sort of facility is any different.

Town Manager Perry read the letter than was sent to the Town of Labrador City (attached).

Deputy Mayor O'Brien stated that regionalization is going to happen whether we like it or not. In her opinion, the bigger we are the better we are. We need to come up with what's best for Labrador West.

Councillor Pynn stated that provincial funding is NOT available for municipalities but is available for regions.

Councillor Cole stated that they are not giving up. Recreation Centre is in warm idle. Since November 2021 no one has come forward with questions. We are audited by an external source. Let's compare Apples to Apples. Labrador City recreation spent \$ 1,000,000 in Recreation with revenue of 190,000. Wabush spent \$ 215,986 in Recreation with revenue of 114,600. Wabush does not included in recreation their donations to organizations, wages, etc. as Labrador City does. Part of the Mill rate included money put away for a new Rec Plex. Where is that money?



Councillor Battcock reassured residents we are working hard for them. We are spending wisely and doing the right thing.

Mayor said it was a unanimous decision but not an easy decision. It is not fair to the taxpayers of Wabush. We are trying to work with our sister town. Not looking for a handout or donations. We need something in the meantime before a new complex is built.

Mayor Barron discussed what was accomplished by the Town over the last 4-6 years. Which includes Wabush Business Park development, Cabot Hill replacement, Wastewater Treatment Plants, replacement of old equipment, water main repairs, new chiller, HVAC system (with Labrador City's help), Electric Zamboni, Jean Lake Trail improvements, playground equipment, dog park and the list goes on. But this is mismanagement? Ballfield fencing, Wheelchair accessibility, street sweeper, student hiring, bunker gear, new gate for grader, retaining wall on Snows Drive. All mismanagement?

I believe everyone on this Council and previous Councils wanted what is best for residents. Its terribly relayed on Facebook (or hate book) for former Councillors to spread misinformation. We are not right all the time but try to do our best.

Councillor Razi stated that her children use the facility. She feels for everyone, however, our conscious could not use Wabush taxpayers' money to fund Recreation for all Labrador West.

Deputy Mayor O'Brien thanked everyone for chiming in. We all have to work together and keep moving forward.



NEW BUSINESS Deputy Mayor O'Brien

Some of the issues brought up by residents to Deputy Mayor O'Brien:

1) Shortage of Housing

There is a Facebook group started that are looking for stats for those looking for rental/housing and those renting their homes. They need numbers for CMHC to show the housing crisis in the area. Housing cost are extremely high, and anyone looking for housing with kids or animals it's almost impossible.

Anyone looking for housing or are landlords please reach out to this group at <u>labcityhousing@gmail.com</u>. The stats may benefit the area and show the housing shortage.

2) Child Care Issues

Nobody here to watch kids. Families have had to leave because they can not get babysitters. Some families are now doing fly in/fly out because childcare issues.



Mayor Barron commented that in meetings with IOC etc., he has stated not to bring anyone else in here. It is just compounding a problem that has not been resolved.

3) Seniors - Assisted Living

Again, the issue of housing shortage and affordable Senior living and assisted living facilities.

4) Pavement – Arena Area

This was no cost to the town as such. It was donated from Greyrock and the ground work done by the Town. The overflow of Arena parking was becoming a huge issue before COVID times and needed a solution. Mayor Barron stated again that this was not a mismanagement of funds.

Councillor Razi

1) <u>Street</u>

Residents have commented that they really appreciated the widening of streets.

2) Recreation Director

Councillor Razi requested Councillor Battcock in conflict for a short discussion. Councillor Battcock left Council Chamber at 7:03 pm.

Councillor Razi discussed concerned as to why the Recreation Manager was not laid off or part time even though the building was idled.

Town Manager stated that the building is idled but still in use. The recreation director is also a power engineer. Without his knowledge, the repair by CIMCO this week on the compressor would not have been noticed. As well, he covers on call duties, a backup supervisor, and busy season is a short few months away.

Councillor Battcock returned to Council Chambers at 7:06 pm.

3) Contracting Out

There was a miscommunication when it came to contracting out. There is no contracting out of driveways and hydrants while people are laid off. In fact, two people have already been recalled for



vacation relief.

4) Doctor Shortage

So many families without family doctor. What as a town can we do? Mayor stated lobby government is the only way. What they are doing isn't working.

Problem is not attracting doctors; it is retaining them. It is not sustainable. They are overworked and they have no family time. They can not maintain that kind of workload. There are now three family doctors in the area.

Mayor stated that the amount of tax dollars from this area should not have the level of care that is here.

Councillor Razi also stated that Newfoundland qualifications and regulations for doctors are too rigid.

Mayor suggested calling on-line programs and writing government.

Councillor Pynn

Did we receive a response from government on the long-term care letter?

Nothing yet. It is a huge issue for the area.

Mayor Barron stated that Cheryl Hardy's family is not alone. Many families have their loved ones shipped out of here because there is nothing here. The money that flows out of here, it should not happen.

Mayor Barron

It is disheartening to see the rhetoric on Facebook when you see people trying to undermine Council because they don't like me. That the Mayor is mismanaging money from people that sat around this table. Mayor described how people use hatebook and its great for keyboard warriors. Councillor Battcock said it is sad and such a shame.

Deputy Mayor O'Brien

Final comment on recreation. Hope to hear from Labrador City soon. It is time to meet up. I will make time for this very important issue. Open for discussion and working together whether it is regionalization, amalgamation or whatever. Realize the Mayor is shaking his head and not saying it is the answer, just open to the conversation.

With no further business, meeting was called to adjournment by Deputy Mayor O'Brien and seconded by Councillor Battcock at 7:23 p.m. Next meeting is scheduled for March 17 at 6:00 p.m.
