#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Deputy Mayor brought up putting a petition for Cheryl Hardy at the front counter in the Town Hall. She also mentioned the house on Anderson and the Town Manger said a letter has been sent. She also asked about the mic and video for chambers and said it would be nice to have better equipment for the streaming of the monthly meeting. The Town Manager said we don't have it yet and also said it would be nice to have.

Deputy mayor Kelly O'Brien also said there will be a Town meeting regarding the MARC and it will be at the Catholic Church in Wabush on Wednesday April 27,2022. Official notice will be posted in the morning. There will also be limited seating and only Wabush residents are invited to attend. Everyone strongly encouraged residents to attend and hear the council's position and voice their concerns and questions. Councilor Bob Cole said they were still considering a few proposals that were still on the table and everyone agreed they were very open to keeping the building in operation if they had partners. The Council had a meeting with Municipal Affairs and will discuss this meeting on Wednesday at the Town meeting.

Councilor Rita Pynn would like our council to lobby the government to call for Nurse Practitioners to have costs covered by them, with severe overcrowding in ER rooms being a concern. She said \$60.00 a visit is unreasonable to seniors and low-income people to pay.



Councilor Pynn also said she was very disappointed in the Provincial Government's 2022 budget as it didn't have any allocated funds for Labrador West. She said she sent an e mail about the lack of funding for our area but has not received a reply. She also said Jordan Brown our NDP representative was doing much to bring Labrador's issues to the House of Representatives.

Mayor Ron Barron voiced his concerns about overcrowding in ER rooms. Industrial accidents in our area are a concern if hospitals are over stretched.

Councilor Bob Cole said MCP should cover the cost of practitioners in the area to elevate overcrowding in our hospital with the shortage of doctors in the area.

Councilor Shazia Razi has a concern about the area having no pediatrician.

Mayor Ron Barron asks the public to contact government officials to voice concerns.

Councilor Rick Burke, Councilor Shazia Razi, and Mayor Ron Barron congratulated all teams in provincial tournaments.

With no further business, meeting was called to adjournment by Deputy Mayor Kelly O' Brien at 6:32 p.m. Next meeting is scheduled for May 19<sup>th</sup>,2022 at 5:30 p.m.
